Spend time with family and friends with paid leave

Take time off. In a nonclinical job at VA, you start your career with 37 to 50 days of paid time off each year. Paid vacation, sick leave, and 11 paid federal holidays accrue right away with no limit on carry-over and accumulated sick leave.
